




Based on our discussion with the Client, we understand that the property is owned by **Mr. Uttam S/o Bhiku Rathod** For the purpose of this appraisal exercise, we have assumed that the subject property has a clear title and is free from any encumbrances, disputes and claims. VCIPL has made no further enquiries with the relevant local authorities in this regard and does not certify the property as having a clear and marketable title. Further, no legal advice regarding the title and ownership of the subject property has been obtained for the purpose of this appraisal exercise. It has been assumed that the title deeds are clear and marketable.

Environmental Conditions

We have assumed that the subject property is not contaminated and is not adversely affected by any existing or proposed environmental law and any processes which are carried out on the property are regulated by environmental legislation and are properly licensed by the appropriate authorities.

Town Planning

Valuation Methodology

For the purpose of this valuation exercise, the valuation methodology used is Direct Comparison Approach Method and Income Approach for analysing development potential.

The Direct Comparison Approach involves a comparison of the property being valued to similar properties that have actually been sold in arms - length transactions or are offered for sale. This approach demonstrates what buyers have historically been willing to pay (and sellers willing to accept) for similar properties in an open and competitive market and is particularly useful in estimating the value of the land and properties that are typically traded on a unit basis.

In case of inadequate recent transaction activity in the subject micro-market, the appraiser would collate details of older transactions. Subsequently, the appraiser would analyse rental / capital value trends in the subject micro-market in order to calculate the percentage increase / decrease in values since the date of the identified transactions.
